Note: this species is known to reside wholly in some rivers so may no longer move through this site or this may only occur intermittently (e.g. during flooding).

\* Pouched lamprey (*Geotria australis*) have been reported elsewhere in the river system. This species migrates from the ocean to nursery habitats in some headwater streams.
